# Why is IR-4 so important?



- 40+ % of your daily consumption comes from minor/specialty crops.
- Basic Pesticide producers spend millions of dollars on developing new products for agriculture.
- As a business they target the larger area crops.
  - Corn, soybean, cotton, wheat, etc.
  - Minor crops, like tomato, cucumber, peppers, , melons, pulse, sugarcane, ginseng, and over 500 other crops.
- NIFA-USDA funded IR-4 partnering with EPA assists the development and incentivizes producers to support these industries by waving registration fees, developing required residue and efficacy data, and extended protection of the data used to support registrations for the entire pesticide.

## Successes

- The IR-4 budget has been flat since 2009 @ ~\$12M
- Success:
  - Hill budget proposed raising it to \$15M
  - Presidents budget Proposed it at \$19M.
  - Key congressional members know how critical IR-4 program is to agriculture..
- While we have these first ever proposed increases, with a stalemated congress, we may continue to have to settle for a continuing resolution, resulting in budgets staying at current levels;
  - meaning that there may be no increases in current IR-4 budget.
